- How can you redesign the traditional granary to fit modern needs?

- 1. First understand the problem of food security through undertaking social design research. Please refer to the PowerPoint or notes from Dr. Osanjo's presentation on Social Design and Social Design Research Methods e.g. Participatory Design, Co-Design, Cultural probes etc + other content from her presentation.
- 2. Develop conceptual solutions or prototypes for your identified problem.
